For our liberation from all that enslaves us, we are given these words as gifts of guidance for living and communing together. A NOTE ABOUT THE PHOTOGRAPH ABOVE: As the service closes each Sunday during Lent, we will continue to hear the song, "In the Bulb, There is a Flower." We invite you to continue to reflect upon the idea that sometimes God's promises are out of sight yet exist within the bulb, always promising a flower.
